We did, however, do some research on what the average cost of things were back in 2017 as compared to the average cost now. Our findings are shown in the table to the right.

As you can see from the table, neither our base facility cost or our kWh costs have gone up, but in comparison to items that many of us use on a day-today basis, there certainly has been an increase. 


