Scam Alert ~~~~~~~~

Members, please be aware that there is a phone scam involving utility customers receiving phone calls from perpetrators warning of immediate disconnection if there is not a payment over the phone. Big Horn REA does not disconnect customers without an in person and phone contact.



If you receive a phone call from a person representing themselves as a Big Horn REA employee and you suspect it is a scam, hang up. Do not give the caller any personal information. Be especially protective of your social security number, bank and credit card numbers, and driver's license number.

You should also not assume that you can trust caller ID to let you know where a caller is located. Because scammers may use internet calling technology, the area code you see may not reflect where they really are. The caller ID may not properly identify who or what location they are representing.

If someone appears at your door claiming to represent Big

Horn REA, you can call us at 1-800-564-2419 to verify the visit. Never let anyone into your home unless you have scheduled an appointment or unless the person has proper identification. The Big Horn REA logo should appear on shirts and vehicles. If you suspect someone is impersonating a Big Horn employee, do not let them into your home and call the police immediately.

Members can safely make payments though Big Horn's website or by calling us at 1-800-564-2419. Our office is open from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. on weekdays.

Finally, please warn neighbors, friends and relatives of these types of scams.

Summer Electrical Safety Tips: Around the Home One of the most important things to remember is that water and electricity don't mix well—in fact, they

that water and electricity don't mix well—in fact, they are deadly dangerous together.

- Keep all electrical toys and appliances away from the water. This
 means pools, bathtubs, sprinkler systems, sinks, etc.
- Do not touch an electrical toy or appliance if you are wet or standing in the water. Electricity travels very quickly through water and leads to electrocution!
- Make sure the electrical connections to your pools and hot tubs are fully grounded. A residential electrician can help you if you have any questions about appliance connections and their safety.
- Make sure all major appliances (washers, dryers, refrigerators, air conditioners, etc.) are plugged into grounded outlets and not extension cords!
- Now is also a good time to go around your home and see that you have GFCI outlets installed in all "wet" areas of your home (bathrooms, kitchens, garages, basements, pool rooms, etc.)
- In the event of an emergency, know where your circuit breakers are and how to safely turn them off.
- Never plug in any appliance if you notice that the cord is frayed or damaged in anyway.

Energy Efficiency Tip of the Month

The combined use of large appliances like dishwashers, clothes drvers and washing machines account for the largest percentage of electricity use in the average U.S home. Take small steps to save energy when using these appliances. Only run full loads in the dishwasher, and thoroughly scrape food from dishes before loading. Dry towels and heavier cottons separate from lighter-weight clothing and clean the lint screen after every use. Wash clothing in cold water to save energy used to heat water.
