»»» TIPS TO AVOID ENERGY SCAMS:

Scammers and cyber criminals look for weak points to exploit before software companies can fix them. Update software programs on your computer, tablet and mobile phone as soon as possible when a newer version becomes available.

Software updates often contain critical patches and protections against security threats. Turn on automatic updates to automatically update your security software, internet browser, operating system and mobile apps.

After careful consideration from board and staff the below table outlines the changes in rates which became effective February 1, 2026. The rates show an overall average rate increase of approximately 5% percent. In conjunction with Big Horn's power supplier Tri-State Generation and Transmission's rate increase of 10% percent which became effective January 1, 2026 and the ever-increasing cost of operations, Big Horn's financials have been impacted. Your board and staff will continue to work diligently in managing costs.

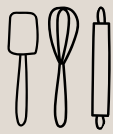

Chicken Enchiladas

Ingredients

- 2-3 chicken breasts (cooked & shredded)
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 can green chiles
- 1 small container of sour cream
- 1 16oz bag colby jack cheese
- Flour tortillas

Makes about 10 enchiladas

Directions

- Cook chicken breasts and shred once cooked.
- Mix together cream of mushroom soup, green chiles and sour cream.
- Combine chicken with mix and add half bag of cheese.
- Take a spoonful of mixture and place on tortilla and roll up.
- Reserve a small portion of the mixture to place on tortillas.
- After all tortillas are wrapped take remaining mixture and spread across wrapped tortillas.
- Bake at 350° for 20 minutes. At the 10 minute mark spread remaining cheese on top of tortillas and continue to bake for 10 minutes.
